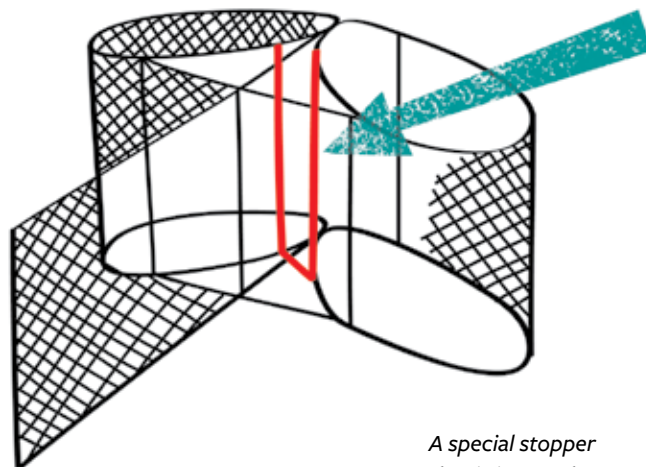

A special stopper that is inserted to a fish trap prevents the ringed seal pup from entering the trap.

FUNNEL STOPPER AND ITS USE:

You can make the special funnel stopper from 6 mm rebar. The stopper must be rigid enough so that the ringed seal cannot spread the funnel of the trap farther than 15 centimeters, as seen in the picture. The stopper is firmly attached to the fish trap using four cable ties.

You can get a stopper for example from FANC's offices in Savonlinna and Lappeenranta. FISH RIGHT WITH A FISH TRAP

FISHING WITH A FISH TRAP IS A NICE HOBBY AND AN EXCELLENT WAY TO GET FRESH AND HEALTHY FISH ON YOUR DINNER TABLE. FOR THE SAIMAA RINGED SEAL IT IS ALSO A FAR BETTER OPTION THAN FISHNET FISHING. BUT WHEN FISHING WITH A FISH TRAP, YOU MUST BE AWARE OF THE APPLICABLE DO'S AND DON'T'S, PERMISSIONS, LICENSING REQUIREMENTS, AND ETHICAL RULES.

PERMISSIONS AND TAGS IN ORDER

When fishing using a fish trap, you always need a separate fishing permission of the owner of the water area. In addition to this a fishing management fee must be paid by people between 18 and 64 years of age (according to the new fishing legislative proposal from the year 2015 onward by everyone who is over 18).

The Fishing Act states that fishing nets must be clearly marked and tagged with a name and contact information.

FISHING RESTRICTIONS RELATED TO THE RINGED SEAL

According to the trap type regulation and the fishing restriction agreement, it is forbidden to use a fish trap with a funnel wider than 15 centimeters (or so loose that the seal pup can enter it) during the spring in the Saimaa ringed seal territories. Therefore, when fishing on Saimaa Lake, one should use a sturdy enough fish trap with a tight funnel, or equip an ordinary fish trap with a so-called funnel stopper or its equivalent (for example cable ties) so the funnel cannot be expanded.

WHAT TO FISH WITH A FISH TRAP?

A fish trap is especially suitable for fishing perch, pike, roach and burbot. A fish trap is usually used in the summer time, but is suitable also for winter fishing. You can try to attract fish to the fish trap using for example twigs or baits.

Good spots for catching pike using a fish trap are e.g. borders of rushes. Burbot can be caught using a fish trap during its spawning period at its breeding ground. Perch and roach can be found at coastal waters amidst aquatic plants and at the borders of underwater rock outcrops.

CAUTION WHILE USING A FISH TRAP

A fish trap must be put in water so that it is fully submerged, or the part of the funnel that is above the water must be closed. Also, when a fish trap is on dry land, you must, by closing its funnel, make sure it won't turn out to be the death trap of a bird or any other animal.

The fish trap must be checked often enough, depending on the conditions, usually once every 1–2 days.

FISH HANDLING

Fish too small in size must always be released and let back to the water. Otherwise the catch should be handled appropriately: stun, bleed, gut, chill. Cook and enjoy!

GET A STURDY FISH TRAP WITH A TIGHT FUNNEL, OR MAKE AN INADEQUATE FISH TRAP SAFE FOR RINGED SEALS BY INSERTING A SPECIAL STOPPER INTO IT.
