LIFE to alvars: restoration and grazing reintroduction for 2500 hectares of Estonian alvar grassland -

PRIVATE LANDOWNER

Before the project no cost and no income from the alvar



• During and after the project- landowners gain one time income from the trees and shrubs cut during the restoration work and long term income from the rent payed by the farmer for the use of the land. Average 50 euro/ha/year.

LOCAL FARMER

• Before the projectnearby alvar out of use as farmland



• During and after the project- reasonable size nearby farmland area gained with no investment cost into restoration, fencing, shelters, watering facilities, collection pens and access roads. Annual income from the agri-environmental subsidies + products like meat and wool. Opportunity to enlarge the herd as new land available for grazing.







INITIAL INVESTMENT

Providing the initial investment kick-starts the long term activity.

LOCAL BUSINESS

• Before the projectnearby alvar out of use



• During and after the project- local companies gained contracts to carry out alvar restoration, fence building and access road renovation work. Local businesses offering tourism services gained a new attractive sites for the visitors.

ADDED-VALUE

Action E.8. Working group for promotion of added-value products from alvar

Budget: 4130,00 EUR

Before the project – no opportunity to sell or buy local meat officially on the Muhu island. Live animals were sold abroad with

low price.









ADDED-VALUE

During and after the project- as a result of the projects added value products working group farmers coop — Muhu Lihawas formed. Farmers now have their own meat selling counter in the local store. Farmers are preparing to build their own small slaughterhouse and meat processing factory on the island.
