Protection of Saimaa ringed seals in a changing environment

Our Saimaa Seal LIFE project aims to enhance the conservation of the Saimaa ringed seal (*Pusa hispida saimensis*) by the following measures:

- Preparing and implementing a genetic rescue plan
- Restoration of breeding habitats by man-made snowdrifts and artificial nests
- Novel monitoring tools and methods
- Research on genetics and health of the Saimaa ringed seal population
- Controlling for fishing restrictions relating to the seals
- We also transfer and replicate the lessons learned in Saimaa to improve the conservation status of the Baltic ringed seal
